Registration and checkins begin at 8 a.m. at The Post Office Café. The 1K fun run begins promptly at 9:30 a.m., and the 5K at 10 a.m. Pre-registration, prior to October 7, costs \$13.00 for the fun run and \$25.00 for the 5K. Cost to register after October 7 is \$15.00 for the fun run and \$30.00 for the 5K.

Online registration closes Thursday, on October 19th at midnight. Thereafter, runners must register in-person at The Post Office Café.
